Places to Visit

Old Oiaonan Street | Qiaonan Street

The street is named Qiaonan ("south of the bridge") because it is located on the southern side of Yanshui Long Bridge. Between the late Ming Dynasty and early Qing Dynasty, this was a major transportation hub for people traveling to Tainan, Chiayi, Beigang, and Putai. It was also a major route connecting the north and south of Taiwan, thus earning it the name "the Main Street of Nanying".

Yuejin Riverside Park

Initiated in 2012, Yuejin Lantern Festival incorpo-

rates local small-town history with cultural and

Yuejin Lantern Festival

The waterview here was once the best among the eight sights of Yuejin. "Every year the night of the Mid-Autumn Festival is the most favored, we stand by the bridge, read poetry, and enjoy the view until dawn." The words depict

the Yanshui locals gracefully strolling on Xinglong Bridge and appreciating the beautiful view of the water and moon.

Xiude Worship Pavilion

The "back lane hall" the older generation refers to is actually Xiude Worship Pavilion. This pavilion and Cide Temple ("across the bridge hall") are two important Buddhism holy locations in Yanshui.



Yanshui Dazhong Temple No. 7, Wumiao Rd.

This is a special municipality historical site. During the Period of Ming Loyalist Koxinga Rule, Yanshui Harbor was built as a trading port and the Jubo Pavilion was built next to the port as a resting site for traveling merchants. It is said that the Grand Lei Fu General, which was worshiped on one of the fishing boats, scared away sea pirates and later became an important spiritual support of the local fisher-

An-Nei Sugar Refinery

One of Taiwan's four old major sugar refineries. It was funded and built in 1903 by Wang Xue-nong and handed over to the Japanese in 1907 who named it the Yanshui Harbor Ltd An-Nei Sugar Refinery. After the Nationalist government came to Taiwan, it was renamed TSC An-Nei Sugar Refinery.

Taiwan Poetry Road In 2000, Yue Jin Cultural & Heritage Development

Association paved the Taiwan Poetry Road with clay slates under the silk cotton tree lane in Tianliao community. The slates show masterpieces of over a dozen poets. Walking on the path is like going back through time and reviewing the many looks of Taiwan in the past century. Visitors also flock here every year when the silk cotton trees blossom.

Wangve Temple No. 16, Ln. 3, Zhongshan Rd.

The main deities worshiped here

are Chi Fu Qian Sui, Li Fu Qian

First Bank Lane | This small lane south of Taiwan First Commercial Bank Yanshui Branch was named First Bank Lane by former Provincial Assembly Speaker Huang Zhao-gin who also served as the Chairman of First Commercial Bank. The lane is about 300 meters long and only 1 meter wide, which allows two people to walk through shoulder to shoulder. The lane still has a section

Octagon Building No. 1, Ln. 4, Zhongshan Rd.

Built in 1847, the Octagon Building is a special municipality histori-

cal site. It used to be known as the Bagua Building and was the site

Wangye Lane

The quaint narrow lane in front of Wangye Temple. The entrance still has long brick walls, showing the former glory of Yanshui.

Liancheng Lane

The small lane behind the Octagon Building. It was named thus because of the Yeh family business "Yeh Liancheng". Its counterpart is Wangye Lane in

Yanshui Tourist Snack Town | Zhongshan Rd. In the past, snack vendors would gather next to the 7-11

convenience store on Zhongzheng Road in an area which was referred to as the "night market". After Zhongshan Road was extended, these former "night market" food stalls relocated to the present Tourist Snack Town.

Yanshui Townhouses

During the Taishō era, the Japanese Occupation government actively conducted "street block correction" projects in Taiwan. The projects, which mainly targeted present Sanfu Road and **Zhongzheng Road, straightened out the** buildings on the streets. After all these years, many stores still kept their classical and elegant Japanese-western-style mansions, and the business name and family crest embossments can still be found on the pebbledashing facades.

Yongcheng Theater | Kangle Rd. (next to Yanshui Tourist Snack Town)

A theater for both film and stage productions, this is one of the three theaters built in Yanshui after WWII. The original theater closed down in the 2000s. but was restored in 2008 with old photographs as reference and repurposed as a multi-functional arts & culture center.

Hubi Mazu Temple | No. 140 uegang Hubi Mazu Temple has a lot of precious

history and art heritages: the door gods and murals are all done by late national treasure painting master Pan Li-shui, the ceramics cuttin and pasting are works by Tainan master Ye Jin-yi, and the tablet inscriptions are important historical artifacts of Yanshui.

《Two days in Yanshui》

Day one: Downtown Tainan → Black-faced Spoonbill Conservation Center → Bird-watching Pavilion → Cigu Salt Mountain, Taiwan Salt Museum → Beimen Jingzaijiao Tile-paved Salt Field → Nankunshen Daitian Temple → Downtown Xinying (stay the night). Day Two: Downtown Xinying → WanPi Safari Zoo → Taiwan Poetry Road → Yuejin Harbor → head home.

Day one: TSC Wusulin Recreational Park → Taiwan Orchid Plantation → Baihe Daxian Temple → Guanziling Biyun Temple → Fire and Water Spring → Guanzihling Hot Spring Area (stay the night). Day Two: Guanzihling Hot Spring Area → Jingliao Old Street → Yuejin Harbor → head home
